

Dr Daniel J. Tolan is a Fellow at The Polansky Academy for Advanced Study in the Humanities and Social Sciences at The Van Leer Jerusalem Institute. He is scholar of late antique thought and spirituality, with a focus on early Christianity and the Platonic tradition. Prior to taking up this Fellowship, he was a Postdoctoral Research Assistant at the University of Cambridge's Centre for the Study of Platonism, where he was the Centre's inaugural Academic Secretary, and where he remains the Senior Principal. He received his MPhil and PhD from the University of Cambridge's Faculty of Divinity as a member of Clare College, and his MA from Yale University. His publications can be found in the *Harvard Theological Review*, *Vigiliae Christianae*, *The International Journal of the Platonic Tradition*, and *Studia Patristica*.
