





# Inception to Orthodoxy: A Journey through the Early Church & the Orthodox Church

#### **OVERVIEW**

How is a devout Orthodox envisaged today? Do Greeks model their lives accordingly? To what extent is Orthodoxy part of the Greek identity?

This Seminar is a journey to the history, faith, liturgy, and spirituality of the Orthodox Church, the largest of the Eastern Christian Churches. Special emphasis will be given to the early Christian world and early Christian values since keeping tradition is of the utmost importance for the Eastern Orthodox Church. The exploration will be based on lectures, readings of primary sources and secondary bibliography, audio-visual presentations, discussion, and personal experience.

Join us in: exploring how Christianity begun, discussing Christianity's formative years, examining the validity of the popular claim that the early Christian world was uniform, and reflecting on how many of the early Christian values are still kept intact.

Goals and Objectives: to familiarize with the rich history, heritage and tradition of the Eastern Orthodox Church; to discover the common spiritual foundation and background of Christianity in East and West; to exhibit awareness of participants' own experience of religious tradition and commitment as well as differences in perspective and opinion; to dispel popular myths and challenge misconceptions about early Christianity.

#### **ABOUT THE PROGRAM**

In partnership with HALC (Hellenic American Leadership Council), College Year in Athens has formed the CYA Hellenic Executive Program (HEP). The CYA HEP, dedicated to bringing CYA's rigorous academic profile in an online format, offers online educational seminars to all interested who desire to further their knowledge on all topics associated with Greece, from ancient civilization to modern-day development.

Each Seminar runs for six weeks, meeting once a week, on Saturdays at 12 noon ET for one hour, followed by an exchange of views between participants and the professor. Sessions typically last between sixty to ninety minutes and are held in a synchronous online teaching environment (via Zoom). Participants have access to material on Moodle and a Zoom Link. After each session, a recording of the lecture is available to participants.

The CYA Hellenic Executive Program has no formal education requirements, recognizing that participants come from diverse backgrounds and with varying experience in the subject of each Seminar; however, the Seminars are rigorous and require academic work. A Certificate of Participation is issued upon completion of each Seminar.

Despina losif holds a PhD in Ancient History from University College London (2004). She finds that religion is the most fascinating aspect of human history and likes to explore how religion affects people's everyday lives and continues to vest powerful emotions. Her main research interests are violence and the body in the Graeco-Roman world, Galen, Libanius, Roman prisons, the emergence of Christianity, and paradoxographic writing in antiquity.

losif has taught History of Religion courses at CYA since 2007. She has also taught at University College London, Democritus University of Thrace, University of Crete, and the Hellenic Open University. She is the author of many books, including Early Christian Attitudes to War, Violence and Military Service (Gorgias Press, 2013), and many articles, including 'Religious Violence' in Augustine in Context, T. Toom, (ed.), Cambridge University Press, Cambridge, 2017, 195-202, and the forthcoming: 'The Oral Slogans of the Graeco-Roman Crowds' in Audience Response in Ancient Greek and Latin Literature, (Brepols, 2024).

She has worked as a Historical Advisor for the BBC1 documentary In the Footsteps of St. Paul. She is also the co-founder and member of the editorial board of the scholarly ejournal on late antiquity PostAugustum (www.postaugustum.com).
