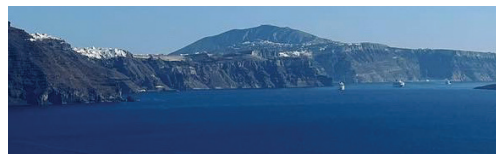
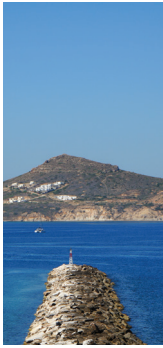




Myth, Memory, and the Modern Mediterranean Discovering Greece from the Peloponnese to the Aegean
